Help End Cervical Cancer

THE FACTS:

- HPV (human papillomavirus) is a very common virus that causes cervical cancer.
- While most women will get HPV at least once during their lives, few women will get cervical cancer.
- You can get HPV through sexual contact with an infected partner.
- Most people who are infected with HPV do not have any symptoms.
- You should not feel ashamed if you have HPV.
- See your healthcare provider regularly for a Pap test. If you are 26 or younger, ask about the HPV vaccine, and if you are 30 or older, ask for an HPV test.
